## Coach Carla Decker

### *Carla Decker, Head Coach*

Carla Decker, hired on Jan. 3, 2006, is the fourth coach in the history of Lander's volleyball team.

She was named Peach Belt Conference Coach of the year in 2007 and again in 2008. She led the Bearcats to a school-record 23 wins (10 losses) in 2007 and to their first appearance in the PBC tournament championship game. In 2008, Lander posted a 22-12 record and earned their first-ever berth into the NCAA national tournament.

Decker is 94-68 in five years at Lander for a .580 winning percentage.

Decker's rookie season with the Bearcats was also memorable as she led the Bearcats to a 20-15 record, a 10-win improvement over the previous year. During her second campaign, the Bearcats finished second in the PBC with a 6-4 record and reached the championship game of the PBC tournament where they lost a five-set thriller to USC Aiken.

Decker served as head coach and senior woman administrator at West Virginia Wesleyan College (2004-05), where she amassed a 39-27 record, including 32-6 in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Decker earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Northern Iowa in 1994 and her Master of Arts and Teaching in Physical Education from the University of South Carolina in 1999.

Prior to West Virginia Wesleyan, Decker spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Presbyterian College and was head coach at Columbia's Ridge View High School for three years.

## Bearcats look to improve in 2011

The Lander volleyball team enters the 2011 season with a mix of experience and youth while taking on a demanding schedule that doesn't include a home match until one month into the season.

On Friday night, Sept. 30, Lander will get to play at home in the Finis Horne Arena against Peach Belt foe Montevallo. But the Lady Bearcats do have eight consecutive home games Oct. 21 – Nov. 2.

"The Peach Belt is at the mercy of the SAC and Conference Carolinas since their conferences are larger than ours and they have fewer open dates. If we want to play them, we go to them," said Carla Decker, who is entering her sixth year as Lander's head coach. "It was also our year to travel. We will be very ready and excited to be playing home a lot in October."

Included in that home stretch is the Lander Crossover Tournament Oct. 21-22 where the Lady Bearcats will face Augusta State in a match that will count in the PBC standings, neighboring rival Erskine College, St. Andrews for a second time this season, and a school that is new to Division II, College of Coastal Georgia.

After the stretch of home games, one last tough road trip wraps up the regular season when Lander visits Armstrong Atlantic State Nov. 4 and faces Flagler College and Lynn University the next day on Flagler's home court in St. Augustine, Fla.

Returning players for the Lady Bearcats, who went 11-16 overall and 5-9 in the PBC last year, include seniors Magi Nottingham (Indianapolis) and Mallory Wasik (Keystone Heights, Fla.), juniors Jordan Rix (Jacksonville Beach, Fla.) and Madison Kubal (Dacula, Ga.), sophomore Hannah Dederick (Lugoff, S.C.) and redshirt freshman Kiki Hennessey (Aiken, S.C.).

Newcomers are sophomore Katelyn Kraft (Cincinnati, Ohio) and freshmen Judith Slow (Hilton Head, S.C.), Jessica Register (Spartanburg, S.C.), Rebekah Davis (Columbia, S.C.), and Anna Padezanin (Milton, Ga.).

With Hennessey being red-shirted last season due to a shoulder injury, six of the team's 11 players will be seeing collegiate game action at Lander for the first time (Kraft played at Anderson University in 2010).

## 2011 Lady Bearcats

The Lady Bearcats open their season at the Carolina Challenge at Lees-McRae, facing the host school and Tusculum Friday evening. They meet Wingate and St. Andrews on Saturday.

Lees-McRae has won the Carolinas Conference 14 of the past 15 seasons, including last year when the team went 25-8 and played in the NCAA Tournament. Tusculum was the SAC runner-up last year, going 16-2 in the league and 25-7 overall. Wingate won the SAC with an 18-0 record in 2010, finished 31-2 overall, and lost in the NCAA quarterfinals.

Lander's top returning players include outside hitter Nottingham who had 250 kills last year, middle blocker Dederick who totaled 193 kills and led the team with 70 blocks, and libero Kubal who paced the Lady Bearcats with 571 digs including a PBC leading 5.24 digs per game.

Lander has a new setter in Register, a 5-foot-8 freshman who played for Woodruff High School and the Club South Youth Volleyball program. She replaces Candace LaRocca, who is the school's all-time leader with 4,638 career assists.

"I have seen her play club volleyball for many years," Decker said of Register. "I've always been a big fan of hers. She has great hands, plays very good defense. And she is a tall setter with the ability to play all the way around and be effective. She is learning the ropes and is filling that role really well. I felt very fortunate that she really liked Lander. I think she is highly capable of being a very good setter here."

Kubal returns to her libero/defensive specialist position after having a good 2010 campaign.

"Madison comes back with tons of experience as a libero," Decker said. "She led the conference in passing and was number one in digs per game. It's great having her come back, especially with so many young players. It's great having Madison back to really focus on setting up our defense."

Kraft, a transfer from Anderson University, also expects to see playing time in the back. Hennessey is also an option.

"She is highly qualified at the libero position and is also very strong defensively," the coach said of Kraft. "Katelyn and Madison are interchangeable at the libero. Katelyn is a great server, a great serve receiver, is great defensively, quick, and very enthusiastic. I just love having her on the court. Where ever I can find her a spot on the back row, she will have a chance to play."

While there is depth at libero and defensive specialist, the same can be said for the setter position.

"Katelyn is actually a very good setter. So she could fit into that role. But our main second setter is Mallory," Decker said of Wasik. "She has been working on setting for a long time now. A couple years ago during the spring season when Candace was overseas, Mallory and another right-side were our setters. She has great hands. She knows how to change up plays. We could run a 6-2 with Mallory and Jessica, or a 5-1 with Jessica. It's great to

have those options."

Nottingham, Hennessey and Wasik are among Lander's outside hitters as well as newcomers Slow, Padezanin and Davis.

"Magi coming back gives us a lot of experience and she is versatile as an outside or right side," Decker said. "She came in as a freshman as a right side player."

"Kiki Hennessey is back this year. She redshirted last year because of shoulder surgery. She is so much fun. She has a lot of shots as an outside hitter and is fantastic defensively. She could easily fit in as a libero. She's got a good vertical, she takes smart shots and her shoulder is better now. So she will be another huge asset on the outside."

Slow is a former gymnast who has only been playing competitive volleyball for two years, Decker said.

"She is a very good hitter, makes smart shots, and has good timing," she said of Slow. "She is still learning the system. She is pretty new to the game of volleyball. She has so much more room for improvement, but she is doing a great job now. She makes progress every day. She has the arm swing to become a very dominant player."

The 6-foot Dederick expects to be the team's top middle blocker.

"Hannah had a lot of playing time last year and got a lot of experience as a freshman," Decker said of the sophomore. "I

think that year under her belt will really help her confidence and her volleyball IQ, and will help her mentor our other middles. She plays very good defense."

Rix has spent her Lander career on the right side but has been asked to move to the middle. Padezanin is also listed as a middle blocker.

"Jordan has seen a lot of time on the right side," Decker said of the 5-11 junior. "But this year we have moved her to the middle because we already have so many players on the outside. The move will help us with our middle depth. She wasn't real excited about it (in the spring), but now it looks like she has played there for a long time. She is doing really well and is a lot more aggressive than she was before."

Decker said Padezanin "was a last-minute find at the club level and was exactly what I was looking for. She is one of the hardest workers that we have on the team. You can put her on the outside or right side. She is good defensively and very coachable. And having her as another strong option in the middle has really helped. Even though she is a little undersized for the middle (at 5-10), she jumps really well and is always aggressive."

Another newcomer, Davis, is in the mix on the right side along with Slow, Wasik and Padezanin.

"I have seen her at club tournaments and she came into our camp," Decker said of Davis. "She is one of those players that I can put anywhere on the court. She is a great athlete and is really doing well. She is fantastic on defense. She moves her feet really

well. She is one of our best serve receivers. She blocks well. She has a great vertical and swings well from both sides of the antennae as an outside or a right side. About the only place that I don't have her working at is in the middle. She is definitely one of those utility players."

The flexibility to play more than one position is ultra-important in college volleyball and Decker feels that the Lady Bearcats have those options.

"We try to train players at two positions so we have rotational options. These girls are really good at two positions," she said. "These girls all are ready to play. We don't have any practice type players."

Team chemistry is another important intangible and Decker said the first few days of practice heading into the season-opener have been encouraging.

"The players really do like each other," said Decker, who was the PBC Coach of the Year in 2007 and Co-Coach of the Year in 2008. "They are a real understanding group of girls.

They are cohesive and have good team chemistry. They are very thoughtful about getting along with each other."

Flagler was picked as the preseason favorite to win the Peach Belt by league coaches, followed by Armstrong Atlantic State, Montevallo, USC Aiken, Francis Marion, UNC Pembroke, Augusta State, and Lander.

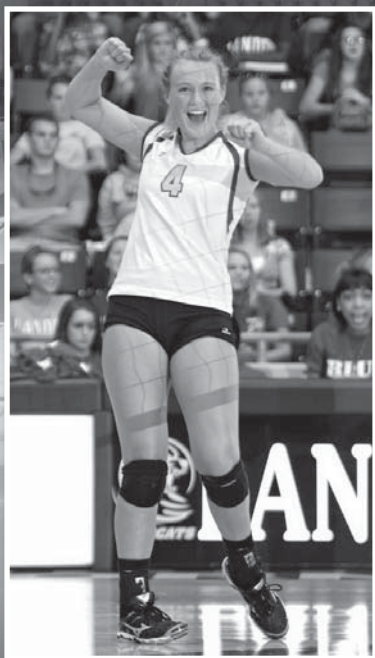


In its first two years in the Peach Belt, Flagler has won two straight regular-season and PBC Tournaments. The Saints are 26-2 against conference competition and 65-18 overall the past two years.

"We have nowhere to go but up," Decker said of the preseason poll. "But I know we are not a last-place team in the conference. I don't put a lot of stock in preseason polls whether we are picked first like we were a couple years ago or at the bottom.

"No matter the talent on the court, you have to play smarter than the other team," she said. "I think you have to be optimistically hopeful."

## Lander caps 2008 season with first trip to NCAA Regional

The 2008 Lander volleyball team was not only invited to the NCAA Division II National Tournament for the first time in program history, the Lady Bearcats, even in defeat, proved that they belonged.

Lander lost in heart-breaking fashion to Armstrong Atlantic State 25-23, 25-23, 17-25, 26-28 and 15-17 in the first round of the Southeast Regional in Wingate, N.C. Armstrong fought off two match points in Game 4 and rallied from a 14-9 deficit in the fifth and deciding game.

While the Lady Bearcats finished the season 22-12, Armstrong went on to capture the Southeast Regional title and lost to Grand Valley State in the quarterfinal round of the NCAA's Elite Eight.

Lander's post-season individual honors were numerous. Lady Bearcats coach Carla Decker was voted the Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year, senior middle hitter Kay Stewart made the All-PBC for the third time and senior outside hitter Kerri Sorensen for the first time.

Sorensen was also named to the NCAA Division II Southeast Region All-Tournament team for her efforts against Armstrong. Then Stewart and Kendall Eayrs became the Bearcats' first-ever AVCA All-Southeast Region players. Stewart was named to the 14-player All-Region team while Eayrs, a junior middle blocker, was named honorable mention.

Stewart was second in the PBC in hitting percentage (.341), fourth in blocks per set (0.97) and seventh in kills per set (2.87). Eayrs was second in the PBC in blocks per set (1.05) and fourth in hitting percentage (.296). Sorensen was eighth in the PBC in kills with 0.44 per set and had double-digit kills in 15 matches. She also averaged 2.43 digs per set and had double digit digs in 14 matches with a season-high 22 twice.

Other major contributors to the team were senior defensive specialist and libero Marina Camps, junior outside hitter and defensive specialist Ashley Ferry, sophomore setter Candace LaRocca, sophomore outside hitter Mallory Wasik, and freshman outside hitter Magi Nottingham.

The Lady Bearcats fell short of their goals of winning the Peach Belt regular-season and tournament championships. But their strong resume, including a victory over No. 1 Wingate, and high region ranking earned them a spot in the national tournament. One of Lander's season highlights was rallying from a two-games-to-none deficit against Peach Belt rival USC Aiken. The Lady Bearcats also had a similar rally against Newberry College and were one of

only two teams to beat Wingate all season.

The NCAA bid, Lander's first in the 11-year history of its program, was especially meaningful to Stewart and Sorensen who were the team's only four-year seniors (Camps was a transfer from West Virginia Wesleyan who came to Lander with coach Decker three years ago).

Four years ago, the Lady Bearcats were 0-12 in the Peach Belt when Stewart and Sorensen were freshmen. They were only 2-10 the following year in Decker's first season as Lander's coach before improving to 6-4 last year and 7-3 in 2008. The team won a school-record 23 games in 2007.

"It's just been an unbelievable turnaround from our freshman year to our senior year," Sorensen said.

"It just shows the great girls that we have had through the years to build this program," Stewart said.

"It's been a fun three years playing with these girls here and it's been a gradual step up each year," Camps added.

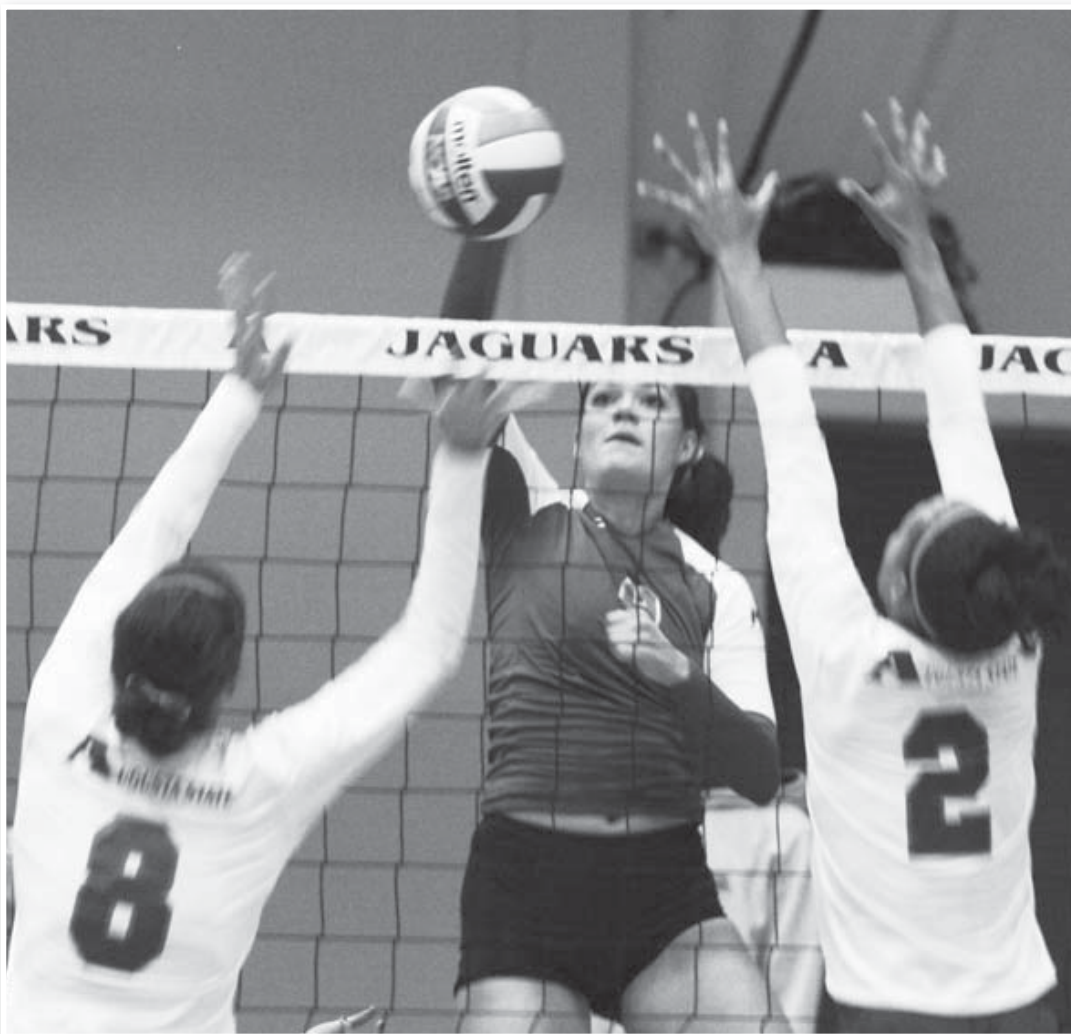

## Lander University at a Glance

Lander University has been providing educational and cultural opportunities to the people of Greenwood County since 1904, when Lander relocated to Greenwood from Williamston, S.C. Founded in Williamston in 1872 as a women's college, Lander is now a coeducational, state-assisted university offering majors, minors and emphases in more than 60 areas of study.

Among the degrees offered by Lander are the bachelor of arts, the bachelor of science, the M.Ed. in Montessori education and the M.A.T. with concentration in art.

Lander is fully accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelor's and master's degrees. The following programs are accredited by their state and national accrediting agencies: athletic training, music, business administration, nursing, teacher education, Montessori program and visual arts.

Full-time enrollment is approximately 3,000 with a student body representing 29 states and 17 foreign countries. The College of Business and Public Affairs enrolls the largest number of majors, followed by the College of Education. Lander has an exceptionally strong science program, and more than 90 percent of those applying to medical school in recent years have been accepted. Students in Lander's engineering dual degree program have a 100 percent acceptance rate at Clemson.

Located in the heart of Greenwood, Lander serves as the cultural focal point of the area. Our Cultural Center houses Lander's Fine Arts programs and this state-of-the-art facility is also the home of the Greenwood-Lander Performing Arts series.

Events for community residents of all ages are hosted by the university. These include the Scholastic Art Awards Competition for junior and senior high school artists throughout South Carolina; a high school theatre festival and Fine Arts study tours.

Lander athletics teams have reaped honors at both the district and national levels, including 12 national championships in men's tennis. A member of the NCAA Division II, Lander plays in the Peach Belt Conference and sponsors teams in men's and women's basketball, golf, soccer and tennis; men's baseball; and women's softball and volleyball.

# About Lander

## HISTORY

Lander University was founded by Methodist clergyman Samuel Lander in 1872 as Williamston Female College in Williamston, S.C. It remained a private institution for 26 years. In 1898, the College gained support of the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. In 1904, the College was relocated to Greenwood, S.C., and was renamed Lander College in honor of its founder.

In 1948, when the Methodist Conference, pursuant to a policy of consolidation in its education efforts, decided to end support of Lander College, interested citizens of Greenwood formed The Lander Foundation as a nonprofit corporation and leased the College from the Church.

In 1951, the county of Greenwood obtained the College name and property from the Methodist Conference. The South Carolina General Assembly created the Greenwood County Education Commission, known as The Lander Foundation, to serve as the board of control for the College. Lander thus became the only four-year liberal arts college in the United States to be controlled and financed by a county government.



On July 1, 1973, Lander College came under the control of the Board of Trustees of the State Colleges of South Carolina, making Lander a state-supported college. The State College Board of Trustees governed Lander, the College of Charleston and Francis Marion College. Effective July 1, 1988, governance of Lander was vested in the Lander College Board of Trustees.

On July 1, 1992, by action of the Board of Trustees, the institution became Lander University.

Lander was founded as a college for women. Men were admitted in 1943, and the institution is now completely coeducational. Lander University subscribes to a policy of equal educational and employment opportunity for all.

## Mission Statement

Grounded in the belief that education is a liberating force which makes it possible for an individual to live a life of meaningful activity, of personal satisfaction, and of service to others as a neighbor and a citizen, Lander University has chosen

teaching and learning as its principal concerns and providing a challenging education for qualified students as its mission. Through its liberal arts programs and its professional schools for business, education and nursing, the university offers an undergraduate curriculum that combines a broad liberal education with specialized study leading either to immediate application in a career or to more advanced study. The undergraduate programs provide opportunities for students to achieve competence in a major discipline and to explore a broad core curriculum designed to assist them in developing the ability (1) to gather and critically analyze information from a variety of fields and to use that information as a basis for reasoned judgments and for effective problem solving, (2) to synthesize diverse ideas and information, and (3) to understand and convey ideas clearly. In addition to its undergraduate programs, Lander provides a limited number of

master's programs and post-graduate courses that respond to critical needs of the immediate region and the state. Supporting the university's role as a teaching institution and recognizing that scholarship is essential to establishing and maintaining excellence of instruction, Lander faculty engage in scholarly and creative activities appropriate to their teaching fields. In addition,

the faculty and staff recognize Lander's responsibility to the public and to the local economy; therefore, the university serves as an intellectual and cultural center and cooperates with various agencies, schools and businesses.

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Lander University has over 60 organizations and clubs, each offering students different opportunities. The choices, challenges and opportunities students face by participating in these organizations will assist them in classes and will allow them to meet new friends and socialize with old friends. There are many different areas to choose from, such as academic organizations, clubs and interest groups, media organizations, club sports, honorary societies, religious organizations, and Greek fraternities and sororities.



## About Lander

Lander's beautiful 123-acre campus is a combination of contemporary and traditional facilities, and the campus is continually growing and changing. Lander boasts a 276,000 item library, the Josephine B. Abney Cultural Center with a beautiful art gallery and 700-seat auditorium, contemporary classrooms and a well-equipped Student Center. Lander's math and science building is equipped with the most advanced equipment and laboratories. Home of Lander basketball, our physical education/athletics complex provides classrooms, a basketball arena, an indoor pool, racquetball courts, an indoor track and a weight room.

Lander is a state-assisted coeducational university with an enrollment of approximately 3,000. Founded in 1872, Lander is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelor's- and master's-level degrees.

### Greenwood - The Emerald City

Greenwood is among the top 10 largest cities in South Carolina with a population of 23,000 and a county population exceeding 66,000. It is located near the Piedmont Plateau in western South Carolina. Greenwood is three to four hours west of the beautiful South Carolina beaches and two to four hours southeast of the popular Blue Ridge Mountains.

Greenwood's climate generally allows for year-round enjoyment of the outdoors! At Lake Greenwood, you'll find public boat landings, bait and tackle shops, fishing piers, picnic and swimming areas, campsites, a variety of restaurants and the Greenwood State Park. For sports enthusiasts, there are many beautifully manicured golf courses in the area as well as Lander's Joe Chandler Physical Education and Exercise Studies Center, the YMCA and the Greenwood Civic Center.

The Greenwood Museum has a variety of exhibits and has twice been recognized as the S.C. Tourist Attraction of the Year in its category. Lander's Monsanto Gallery receives over 500 visitors monthly to view exhibits of Southeastern artists. The Greenwood Community Theatre offers plays and musicals throughout the year, including children's theatre. And the Greenwood-Lander Performing Arts sponsors an annual series of concerts and events that brings international music, dance and theatre to Lander's Josephine B. Abney Cultural Center stage.

### SUPPORT SERVICES

Lander offers a number of programs to ensure that all students reach their highest potential inside and outside of the classroom. These services are free to the students and we encourage every student to take advantage of them. They often make the difference when a student is encountering difficulties in college.

#### Academic Success Center

The Academic Success Center (ASC) provides quality services to students and faculty through a variety of retention efforts. These efforts include peer tutoring, academic advising for high-risk students, advising seminars for faculty, an intervention program for students on academic probation (SASP), one-on-one mentoring, study skills classes (College Seminar 101), high school-to-college transition programs for incoming freshmen, and

advisement/registration assistance to incoming and future transfer students. Additionally, the Academic Success Center offers placement and CLEP testing and preparation for PRAXIS exams (Education major only). Furthermore, the Academic Success Center coordinates the accommodations for students with disabilities in conjunction with the Wellness Center.

#### Career Services

The Office of Career Services provides education, counseling, information and assistance to Lander students in areas that are related to career choices and employment opportunities. These services include individual career counseling, career fairs, interest preference testing, career Internet lab and library, graduate school resources, on-campus interviews, career presentations (resume' writing, interviewing skills, etc.) and a part-time/full-time job posting service.

#### Counseling Services

Offices within the Department of Counseling Services exist in order to help prevent problems, or to assist students in dealing with problems once they occur. Personal counseling is available at no charge on an individual, confidential basis to any student experiencing difficulties such as low morale, relationship problems, time management pressures, alcohol or drug abuse, or poor academic performance. Personal counseling is accessible by appointment or on a walk-in basis for students.

## LANDER'S CAMPUS LIFE

#### Residence Life

Lander's residence halls offer an ideal living environment for student's right on campus. Besides the convenience of living close, residence life allows students to encounter a full college experience. Meeting new friends, living away from home and no monthly bills are just a few advantages to residence life. Lander's campus is also safe, friendly and convenient with parking areas outside each residence hall.

#### Safety

Lander University provides a 24-hour certified police force to enforce federal, state, and local laws, and university rules and regulations. They also administer the university vehicle registration and parking policies and offer educational and crime prevention programs for students, faculty and staff.

Lander also has a formal Emergency Action Plan which establishes procedures that will aid officials in determining the best use of resources to manage disasters, minimize loss of life and injury, and protect resources and facilities. Officers are available to escort students, faculty and staff as a safety precaution to and from areas on campus. Emergency speaker telephones are located across campus. These phones are wired with emergency buttons that will automatically dial University Police.

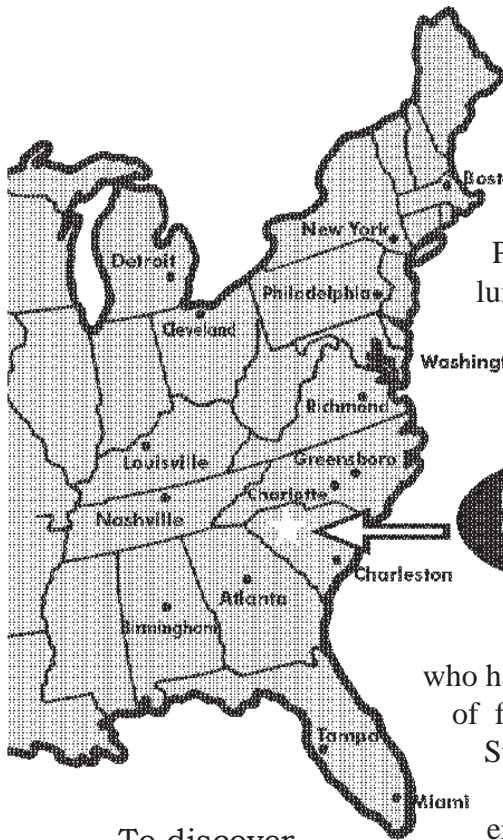
