Experienced Lady Bearcats picked fifth in Peach Belt

The 2011 Lander women's soccer squad will go down in history as the team that gets to open the school's new Jeff May Complex. Lady Bearcats coach Chris Ayer calls this distinction a real honor.

Although the Lady Bearcats actually open their season at home Thursday versus Wingate on the field that they have called home for years, they will be the first team to have an official game at the May Complex as the opener of a women's and men's soccer double-header Sept. 7 versus rival Erskine College.

"We are extremely excited about the Jeff May Complex," Lander coach Chris Ayer said. "It is an incredible facility and has elevated our already good facilities into a great one. The details in this facility are top notch and really make a nice intricate setting for a soccer match."

The Lady Bearcats are coming off a season in which they finished 9-7-1 overall and 4-5-1 in the Peach Belt Conference. Ayer is entering his sixth season as coach, having posted a 44-37-4 career record at Lander.

The first match at the May Complex is highly anticipated.

"The girls love the surface and look forward to calling the May Complex home," Ayer said. "Being the first team to open the complex is an honor and it is going to be nice to share that with the men's soccer program."

"It is a great opportunity to show everyone that Lander University and the Greenwood community have something new to be proud of. It's also Erskine. It's going to be a great day."

The senior class of 2010 was the winningest in Lander women's soccer program history, posting a four-year record of 40-25-4. But while that class has moved on, plenty of solid, experienced players return for the 2011 season including junior preseason All-Peach Belt playmaker Jamie Shaw (Columbia) and her sister sophomore Danielle Shaw, who was Lander's Most Valuable Player in 2010.

Also returning are co-captains senior Christina Barbour (Mooresville, N.C.) and junior Kendall Couch (Tifton, Ga.), as well as senior goalkeeper Chelsea Beetch (Palmer, Alaska), and seniors Katie Finkle (Chattanooga, Tenn.) and Carly Murray (Uniontown, Ohio).

Also returning are juniors Sam Vickers (Irmo, S.C.), Brianna Pagano (Deer Park, Ill.), Lara Middlebrook (Waxhaw, N.C.), Lauren McDonald (Cooper City, Fla.), and Casi Jones (West Columbia, S.C.), and sophomores Nina Morales (North Augusta, S.C.), Jenny Peterson (Del Ray Beach, Fla.), and Jean Weisner (Hilton Head, S.C.).

Big senior losses from last year include Christin Moss, who is a student-assistant coach with the team this year; starting defenders Rachel Datz and Ashton Tatum, and Jessica Skowron, Kasie Sears, Kat Lyytikainen, Kelley Maupin, Georgia Mahon and Katherine Baltz.

Moss, Datz, Tatum, Skowron and Maupin started the majority of the games during their four years in the program, producing a school record of 13 wins in 2007 and 11 victories in 2009.

of the Year after leading the Lady Bearcats to their best record — 13-5 — in school history.

Ayer came to Lander from Coker College, where he was the head women's soccer coach from 2002-06 and doubled as the head men's soccer coach since 2003. Ayer holds a USSF "A" license. For the past thirteen summers he has served as a senior staff coach at the Ralph Lundy Soccer Academy.

Ayer, a native of Columbia, S.C., earned his bachelor's degree in biology from

David Lipscomb (Tenn.) University and played for the Bison's soccer team.

After graduating from Lipscomb, Ayer spent two years as an assistant coach for his alma mater's men's and women's soccer teams, while earning his Master's degree in instructional leadership.

Ayer has served as a staff coach for the Region II ODP for the past two years.

Chris is married to the former Kristen Plummer of Nashville, Tenn., and they have one son, Zachary Thomas.

"We lost some seniors, but we have a lot of pieces coming back and a good group (of newcomers)," Ayer said.

Incoming freshmen include goalkeepers Kelsey Blair (Fort Mill, S.C.) and Kristen Rahl (Raleigh, N.C.), Miranda Barker (Thomson, Ga.), Casey Black (Woodruff, S.C.), Sarah Piechocki (Coral Springs, Fla.), and Hilary Ferguson (Charleston, S.C.). Also joining the team is Appalachian State transfer Kimberly Kesler (Spartanburg, S.C.).

Beetch is the incumbent goalkeeper and is in a battle with Rahl, while Blair is recovering from an injury suffered in the spring. Beetch played in eight games last fall as a backup to Baltz,

making four starts. Beetch allowed six goals and made 24 saves in 485 minutes and 11 seconds of action. The Alaskan had one shutout against Flagler College last year, and posted five shutouts as a sophomore in 2009.

"It's a good competition," Ayer said of the goalkeeper position. "Chelsea is solid. I hope she has a good year."

Lander's defense will have some new faces in the starting lineup with Datz and Tatum no longer patrolling the back. Danielle Shaw and Sam Vickers return to the defense as starters with Finkle, Weisner, McDonald and Ferguson in the mix for the other two spots. Also being considered in the back is Murray, a midfielder in 2010.

"We are toying with the possibility of putting Carly Murray back there," Ayer confirmed. "She is such a good player and is so diverse. She brings something different to that position. Hilary Ferguson has had a good camp. Katie Finkle, Murray and Jean Weisner have all played well. These are some tough decisions that we have to make."

Middlebrook and Couch head the midfield as returning starters with Peterson, Piechocki and Black battling for playing time. Couch was Lander's second leading scorer last season with five goals to go along with three assists, while Middlebrook had two goals and two assists.

"It's probably the most depth in the midfield that I've had in a long time," Ayer said.

The Lady Bearcats have plenty of playmakers up front, led by Jamie Shaw (eight goals and three assists in 2010) and Barbour (four goals, two assists). Other forwards include Morales, Jones, Pagano, Barker and Kesler.

"It's a solid group," Ayer said. "There is lots of depth and they are working hard. There is a lot of talent and versatility."

Shaw was second team All-Peach Belt last fall and is one of the best athletes in the conference, even playing three games at goalkeeper where she allowed three goals and had 11 saves in 114 minutes and 42 seconds. A transfer from East Carolina University's basketball program, Shaw led Lander in scoring in 2010.

"She has all the attributes to get it done and she is a very good player," Ayer said of Shaw.

Very few starting positions or roles were nailed down a week before the season was to start, and Ayer said more position changes could come.

"You've got to get your best 11 on the field. We might have to move some people around," he said. "The competition is making us better. It pushes the kids every day, and when you have your best players working hard, that rubs off on the rest of the team."

Ayer said his players are in the best physical shape as a group that he has had at Lander.

"It's the first time that I have ever had every kid on the team field-wise pass the test, and it was the toughest fitness test I have ever had," Ayer said. "The team lifted the kids who were struggling."

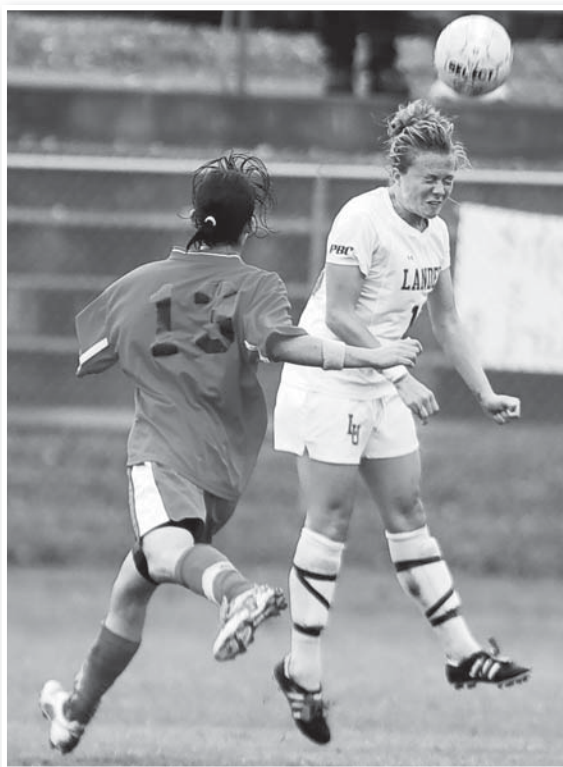
Lander's non-conference schedule includes Wingate, Erskine, Anderson University, Mars Hill and Carson-Newman. Also on the non-league slate is a game this Saturday at Coker College, where Ayer formerly coached. It will be Ayer's first trip back as an opposing coach.

"Our non-conference schedule will help us get prepared for the Peach Belt, which is arguably the best conference in the country," Ayer said. "You can't take a day off in our conference."

Armstrong Atlantic is the preseason favorite to win the Peach Belt, according to the coaches poll. The Lady Bearcats also open their Peach Belt schedule at Armstrong on Sept. 10.

Columbus State is picked second in the poll, followed by North Georgia, UNC Pembroke and Lander fifth.

"I always embrace the underdog role because that always gives us something to shoot for," Ayer said. "We haven't proven anything yet, but we are working hard to accomplish our goals. And our goal is to just get better every day."

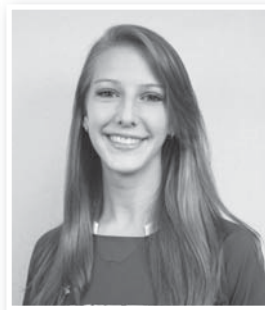

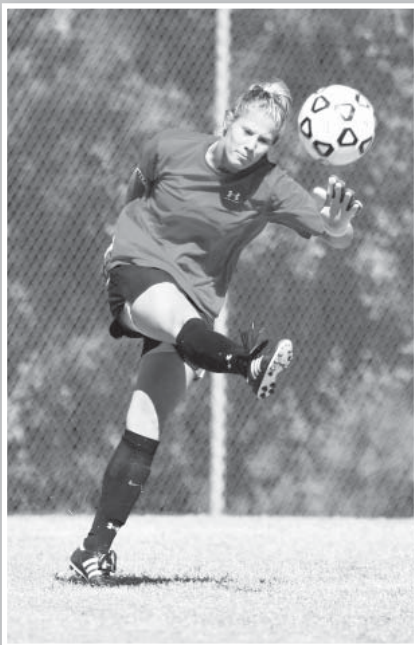

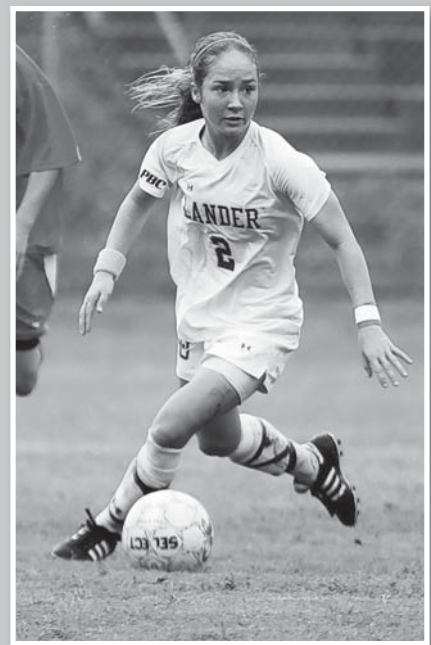

Lander University at a Glance

Lander University has been providing educational and cultural opportunities to the people of Greenwood County since 1904, when Lander relocated to Greenwood from Williamston, S.C. Founded in Williamston in 1872 as a women's college, Lander is now a coeducational, state-assisted university offering majors, minors and emphases in more than 60 areas of study.

Among the degrees offered by Lander are the bachelor of arts, the bachelor of science, the M.Ed. in Montessori education and the M.A.T. with concentration in art.

Lander is fully accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelor's and master's degrees. The following programs are accredited by their state and national accrediting agencies: athletic training, music, business administration, nursing, teacher education, Montessori program and visual arts.

Full-time enrollment is approximately 3,000 with a student body representing 29 states and 17 foreign countries. The College of Business and Public Affairs enrolls the largest number of majors, followed by the College of Education. Lander has an exceptionally strong science program, and more than 90 percent of those applying to medical school in recent years have been accepted. Students in Lander's engineering dual degree program have a 100 percent acceptance rate at Clemson.

Located in the heart of Greenwood, Lander serves as the cultural focal point of the area. Our Cultural Center houses Lander's Fine Arts programs and this state-of-the-art facility is also the home of the Greenwood-Lander Performing Arts series.

Events for community residents of all ages are hosted by the university. These include the Scholastic Art Awards Competition for junior and senior high school artists throughout South Carolina; a high school theatre festival and Fine Arts study tours.

Lander athletics teams have reaped honors at both the district and national levels, including 12 national championships in men's tennis. A member of the NCAA Division II, Lander plays in the Peach Belt Conference and sponsors teams in men's and women's basketball, golf, soccer and tennis; men's baseball; and women's softball and volleyball.

The university's 130,000-square-foot John Drum-

About Lander

HISTORY

Lander University was founded by Methodist clergyman Samuel Lander in 1872 as Williamston Female College in Williamston, S.C. It remained a private institution for 26 years. In 1898, the College gained support of the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. In 1904, the College was relocated to Greenwood, S.C., and was renamed Lander College in honor of its founder.

In 1948, when the Methodist Conference, pursuant to a policy of consolidation in its education efforts, decided to end support of Lander College, interested citizens of Greenwood formed The Lander Foundation as a nonprofit corporation and leased the College from the Church.

In 1951, the county of Greenwood obtained the College name and property from the Methodist Conference. The South Carolina General Assembly created the Greenwood County Education Commission, known as The Lander Foundation, to serve as the board of control for the College. Lander thus became the only four-year liberal arts college in the United States to be controlled and financed by a county government.

On July 1, 1973, Lander College came under the control of the Board of Trustees of the State Colleges of South Carolina, making Lander a state-supported college. The State College Board of Trustees governed Lander, the College of Charleston and Francis Marion College. Effective July 1, 1988, governance of Lander was vested in the Lander College Board of Trustees.

On July 1, 1992, by action of the Board of Trustees, the institution became Lander University.

Lander was founded as a college for women. Men were admitted in 1943, and the institution is now completely coeducational. Lander University subscribes to a policy of equal educational and employment opportunity for all.

Mission Statement

Grounded in the belief that education is a liberating force which makes it possible for an individual to live a life of meaningful activity, of personal satisfaction, and of service to others as a neighbor and a citizen, Lander University has chosen

teaching and learning as its principal concerns and providing a challenging education for qualified students as its mission. Through its liberal arts programs and its professional schools for business, education and nursing, the university offers an undergraduate curriculum that combines a broad liberal education with specialized study leading either to immediate application in a career or to more advanced study. The undergraduate programs provide opportunities for students to achieve competence in a major discipline and to explore a broad core curriculum designed to assist them in developing the ability (1) to gather and critically analyze information from a variety of fields and to use that information as a basis for reasoned judgments and for effective problem solving, (2) to synthesize diverse ideas and information, and (3) to understand and convey ideas clearly. In addition to its undergraduate programs, Lander provides a limited number of

master's programs and post-graduate courses that respond to critical needs of the immediate region and the state. Supporting the university's role as a teaching institution and recognizing that scholarship is essential to establishing and maintaining excellence of instruction, Lander faculty engage in scholarly and creative activities appropriate to their teaching fields. In addition,

the faculty and staff recognize Lander's responsibility to the public and to the local economy; therefore, the university serves as an intellectual and cultural center and cooperates with various agencies, schools and businesses.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Lander University has over 60 organizations and clubs, each offering students different opportunities. The choices, challenges and opportunities students face by participating in these organizations will assist them in classes and will allow them to meet new friends and socialize with old friends. There are many different areas to choose from, such as academic organizations, clubs and interest groups, media organizations, club sports, honorary societies, religious organizations, and Greek fraternities and sororities.

Greenwood - The Emerald City

Greenwood is among the top 10 largest cities in South Carolina with a population of 23,000 and a county population exceeding 66,000. It is located near the Piedmont Plateau in western South Carolina. Greenwood is three to four hours west of the beautiful South Carolina beaches and two to four hours southeast of the popular Blue Ridge Mountains.

Greenwood's climate generally allows for year-round enjoyment of the outdoors! At Lake Greenwood, you'll find public boat landings, bait and tackle shops, fishing piers, picnic and swimming areas, campsites, a variety of restaurants and the Greenwood State Park. For sports enthusiasts, there are many beautifully manicured golf courses in the area as well as Lander's Joe Chandler Physical Education and Exercise Studies Center, the YMCA and the Greenwood Civic Center.

The Greenwood Museum has a variety of exhibits and has twice been recognized as the S.C. Tourist Attraction of the Year in its category. Lander's Monsanto Gallery receives over 500 visitors monthly to view exhibits of Southeastern artists. The Greenwood Community Theatre offers plays and musicals throughout the year, including children's theatre. And the Greenwood-Lander Performing Arts sponsors an annual series of concerts and events that brings international music, dance and theatre to Lander's Josephine B. Abney Cultural Center stage.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Lander offers a number of programs to ensure that all students reach their highest potential inside and outside of the classroom. These services are free to the students and we encourage every student to take advantage of them. They often make the difference when a student is encountering difficulties in college.

Academic Success Center

The Academic Success Center (ASC) provides quality services to students and faculty through a variety of retention efforts. These efforts include peer tutoring, academic advising for high-risk students, advising seminars for faculty, an intervention program for students on academic probation (SASP), one-on-one mentoring, study skills classes (College Seminar 101), high

school-to-college transition programs for incoming freshmen, and advisement/registration assistance to incoming and future transfer students. Additionally, the Academic Success Center offers placement and CLEP testing and preparation for PRAXIS exams (Education major only). Furthermore, the Academic Success Center coordinates the accommodations for students with disabilities in conjunction with the Wellness Center.

Career Services

The Office of Career Services provides education, counseling, information and assistance to Lander students in areas that are related to career choices and employment opportunities. These services include individual career counseling, career fairs, interest preference testing, career Internet lab and library, graduate school resources, on-campus interviews, career presentations (resume' writing, interviewing skills, etc.) and a part-time/full-time job posting service.

Counseling Services

Offices within the Department of Counseling Services exist in order to help prevent problems, or to assist students in dealing with problems once they occur. Personal counseling is available at no charge on an individual, confidential basis to any student experiencing difficulties such as low morale, relationship problems, time management pressures, alcohol or drug abuse, or poor academic performance. Personal counseling is accessible by appointment or on a walk-in basis for students.

Residence Life

Lander's residence halls offer an ideal living environment for student's right on campus. Besides the convenience of living close, residence life allows students to encounter a full college experience. Meeting new friends, living away from home and no monthly bills are just a few advantages to residence life. Lander's campus is also safe, friendly and convenient with parking areas outside each residence hall.

Safety

Lander University provides a 24-hour certified police force to enforce federal, state, and local laws, and university rules and regulations. They also administer the university vehicle registration and parking policies and offer educational and crime prevention programs for students, faculty and staff.

Lander also has a formal Emergency Action Plan which establishes procedures that will aid officials in determining the best use of resources to manage disasters, minimize loss of life and injury, and protect resources and facilities. Officers are available to escort students, faculty and staff as a safety precaution to and from areas on campus. Emergency speaker telephones are located across campus. These phones are wired with emergency buttons that will automatically dial University Police.

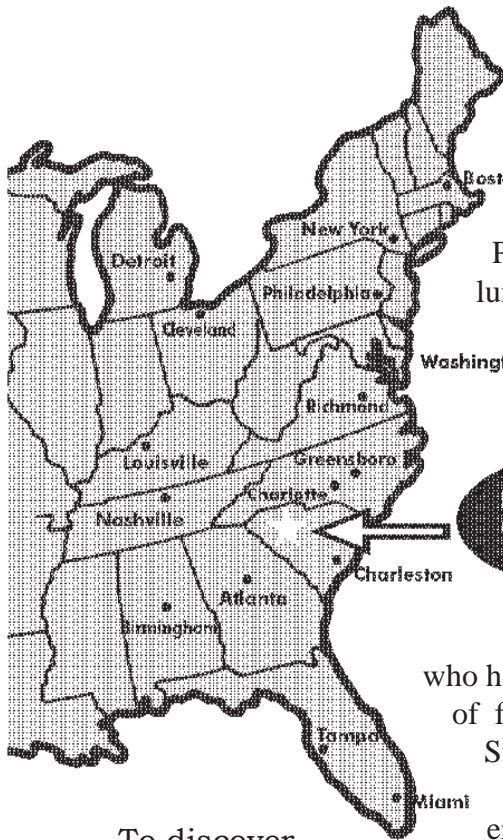

LOCATION: Greenwood is located near the middle of the Piedmont Plateau in western South Carolina.
