## Custom Newspapers

**Custom Newspapers** allows you to search for full-text articles in over 150 national and international newspapers, including the *New York Times*

For instance, if you only wish to retrieve articles that are opinion/ editorial pieces, then you can select the appropriate link to reduce the number of articles retrieved from 36,043 to 5,822. Or you can reduce the number of articles retrieved by searching within the results.

Custom Newspapers allows you to search for articles in a specific Newspaper title.

To search articles from only one newspaper:

- On the Custom Newspaper front page, select *Advanced Search*.
- Enter the desired title (*New York Times*) into the box for “by publication title”.
- Next, back at the top of the *Advanced Search* page, you can enter a keyword to search for articles published within that newspaper.

To Search Custom Newspapers for a specific Newspaper:

- Select the *Publication Search* tab at the top of the home page.
- Enter a title into the search box

The page gives the **Title** again. The **Source** provides the name of the newspaper that the article is in, article’s the publication date and page numbers. Note: In the text at the bottom of the image, you will see in red the words that make up the keyword search (“global warming”).
