"The number of people experiencing hunger and **homelessness** is rising, and communities are strained for resources to deal with these issues."

Homelessness and hunger are growing problems nationwide, claims the National Student Campaign Against Hunger **Homelessness** (NSCAHH) in the following viewpoint. The problem is not limited to urban areas, the student action group maintains, but is also increasing in small towns and rural areas. Since the 1980s, churches and charitable organizations have recognized the need for food banks and shelters to feed and house the growing **homeless** population, NSCAHH asserts, yet government funds to address the problem are decreasing, making it difficult for American communities to cope.
