

Full-time Faculty Position in Criminology Lander University

The Department of Government, Criminology, & Sociology at Lander University invites applicants for a full-time faculty position in Criminology with preference to begin in January 2024, but negotiable for August 2024.

Eligible candidates should possess experience in teaching both face-to-face and online courses. The candidate should be committed to teaching excellence, enthusiastic about advising and mentoring students, willing to contribute to collaborative efforts in recruitment, retention, and overall departmental growth, and work effectively with a diverse student population. Lander supports on-going training in teaching excellence for faculty. We seek candidates who will serve our current degree programs and help to develop new courses within the fast-growing Criminology program, related to their areas of specialization.

One possible position is a **tenure-track Assistant Professor of Criminology**. Eligible candidates will, at minimum, be ABD in Criminology. Teaching load is 24 hrs. per year plus university service and on-going scholarship. Responsibilities include introductory courses and ability to offer upper-level courses in criminological theory, policy, and ethics.

Candidates who do not have a terminal degree or who do not wish to pursue on-going scholarship may apply for another possible position as a non-tenure track **Lecturer** or **Assistant Teaching Professor** with opportunities for promotion. Minimum requirements are a master's degree in Criminology, Criminal Justice or related field; some teaching experience (online preferred); and a preference for criminal justice and/or supervisory experience. Teaching load is 24-30 hrs. of a mix of face-to-face and online courses. Service includes Program Coordinator for the online CRIM program and may include teaching opportunities at University Center of Greenville.
