- Provides in-person and online research consultation services to students and faculty, including assistance with locating open educational resources (OER).
- Assesses library instruction activities.
- Collection development and maintenance in assigned areas.
- Serves on faculty and university committees.

Qualifications

- Master's level degree in library science/ library information science from an accredited institution.
- Demonstrated digital fluency and enthusiasm for learning new tools.
- Knowledge of information literacy pedagogical practices that map to the ACRL Framework.
- Ability to leverage technology to enhance user experience and access to library information resources and services.
- Ability to continuously adapt to progressive technological change.

Preferred qualifications:

- Previous work in an academic library setting.
- Previous experience using game-based and/or other immersive experiences to enhance delivery of information literacy instruction.
- Experience using integrated library systems (Alma or other ILS), Springshare's LibApps products, and discovery tools (Primo or comparable system).
- Knowledge of HTML/CSS.
- Previous project work conducting UX (User Experience) research studies and design.
