**Major Program Electives:**  
**Upper-level Literature Course** (3 credit hours): ENGL 301, ENGL 303, ENGL 304, ENGL 311, ENGL 312, ENGL 322, ENGL 325, ENGL 326, ENGL 338, ENGL 339, ENGL 401, ENGL 402, ENGL 403, ENGL 406, or ENGL 414  
**Language Course** (3 credit hours): ENGL 344, ENGL 345, ENGL 413, ENGL 445. In addition to the courses just listed, students may choose a 100-level course from a different language than that used to fulfill the Major Program Foreign Language requirement or a 200-level course from the same language: FREN 101, FREN 102, FREN 203, SPAN 101, SPAN 102, SPAN 203, SPAN 204, SPAN 205.
