Additional Requirements:

All students must choose at least one of the following pathways as part of their program of study that require approval from the Program Coordinator:

- a semester studying abroad in a university approved program (the spring semester of Year 3 has been kept open to facilitate this option)
- an overseas study tour led by a Lander faculty member
- an internship (either HIST 490 or POLS 490) focusing on international studies
- 200-level foreign language fluency (C or better in a 200-level language course)

Students are required to add a second major or a minor to this program of study. Students majoring in International Studies cannot minor in International Studies.

Recommended courses not listed above include ECON 101, GEOG 101, and POLS 101. Introductory courses are required to take upper-level courses in most disciplines, so students should check a course's pre-requisites before making choices in the Major Program Area Requirements.
