Instructions for Foreign Language Assessment

- 1. If you are interested in an upper-level foreign language course, please complete the Foreign Language Assessment as soon as possible following your acceptance to Lander University.
- 2. Please disable your pop-up blocker in order to complete this test.
- 3. Please ensure that you have audio capability if you are taking the Spanish Placement Assessment.

How to Begin the Foreign Language Assessment:

- Login to Blackboard. (This login information should be your regular login.)
- Click on "Courses."
- Click on "Course Catalog" to the top right of Blackboard.
- Under the "Browse Categories," click the drop down arrow, select "Self-Enrollment Courses," and click "Go."
- Click the drop down arrow beside ENGFL-Placement, click "enroll", and then click "submit."
- The course will now appear within your "My Courses."
- Once you are into this course, read the introduction and instructions, and then click "Spanish Placement Test" or "French Placement Test, which are located on the black bar on the left of the screen underneath "Foreign Language Assessment" and "Information."*
- Each assessment is timed so please pace yourself. If you are taking the Spanish Assessment, please ensure you are able to hear the audio.
- After you submit your test for scoring you will get an immediate result. Please view the PDF titled "What Does My Score Mean?" for your recommended placement.

- This result will then be processed within 5-7 business days and is reflected on Bearcat Web under the Student, Student Records, and Student Test Scores tab.
