Nursing

For more than 50 years, the William Preston Turner School of Nursing has engaged students in didactic and clinical learning experiences, becoming a trusted resource for county and regional hospitals, private and public clinics, and long-term care facilities. Graduates are eligible to take the national licensure exam, and Lander offers an online R.N. to B.S.N. option, as well as an online master's-level Clinical Nurse Leader program.

Psychology

The psychology program enables students to think logically and objectively, and to put the skills they gain into practice by volunteering with local service agencies and presenting original research at state, regional and national psychology conferences. These experiences ensure graduates of the program are able to approach and gather information, conceptualize problems and arrive at reasonable conclusions—skills that are applicable in virtually any professional field.

Biology

Lander's biology programs provide exceptional classroom and laboratory instruction, as well as distinctive research experiences. Students have conducted research in areas like the biology of local freshwater ecosystems and the cellular physiology of microscopic organisms, and have taken advantage of the nearby, world-renowned Greenwood Genetic Center. Graduates take with them a marketable degree for careers in the medical, genetics and medical research fields.

Exercise Science

The exercise science program combines an in-depth look at anatomy, physiology, stress response and client education with exceptional laboratories, an elevated walk/jog track, aerobics and dance studios, and a state-of-the-art fitness center. The result is a respected, hands-on program that prepares graduates for careers in public, private and corporate fitness programs; physical, occupational and cardiac rehabilitation; and strength and conditioning.

Pre-Professional Studies

Students in Lander's pre-professional programs gain outstanding education and preparation for careers in medicine, veterinary science, dentistry, podiatry, pharmacy, and occupational and physical therapy. The programs combine early, individual advising with relevant experiential learning experiences that allow students to tailor their studies to meet the requirements of their graduate school of choice.

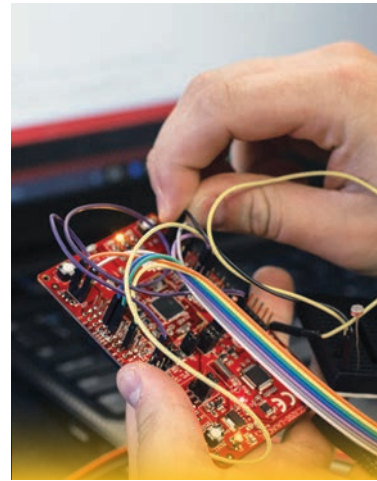

Criminology and Criminal Justice

Lander's criminology and criminal justice programs provide a solid foundation for graduate study and careers in probation and corrections, law enforcement, juvenile justice and natural resources. Students explore topics and themes shaping law enforcement on local, state and national levels, gaining a deeper understanding of the complex world of criminal justice.

Homeland Security and Emergency Management

The homeland security minor and master's degree in emergency management examine the many potential threats our nation faces, helping students recognize and analyze the issues associated with those risks. Students review all phases of a crisis—from prevention and preparedness to first response and recovery—preparing to provide expert guidance during emergencies in the private, public and nonprofit sectors.

Cybersecurity

We live in a digital society, one that is vulnerable to data hacks, financial terrorism, destructive viruses and other issues that can disrupt our daily lives. Because of this, cybersecurity is considered one of the most critical areas of national security. Students in this program are introduced to various aspects of this comprehensive field, from network security to cryptography and computer forensics.

Government Administration

Lander's political science-public administration major and public administration minor empower students to learn the challenges and opportunities within government administration on multiple levels, from public budgeting to international politics.

Media and Communication

This program prepares students to become effective verbal and written communicators, while also sharpening their skills with traditional and innovative media technologies. Students engage in PR, video production, television, film, radio, web, print and performance, utilizing state-of-the-art technology in a media-rich environment. Facilities include the LUX TV studio with an HD production suite, teaching and editing labs, audio recording booths, and a greenroom studio.

Teacher Education

Lander's broad array of teacher education programs enables students to work closely with their professors and community educators before stepping into the classroom to teach in public and private school systems. Our graduates are recruited heavily for positions throughout the Southeast, and many have been named teachers of the year.

NCATE The Standard of Excellence in Teacher Preparation

Lander's Teacher Education program is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education Certification (NCATE), and the university is a South Carolina Teaching Fellows institution. Lander's Montessori education program is fully accredited by the Montessori Accrediting Council for Teacher Education (MACTE), and the institution is one of a few universities in the country to offer a program leading to national teacher certification in Montessori education.

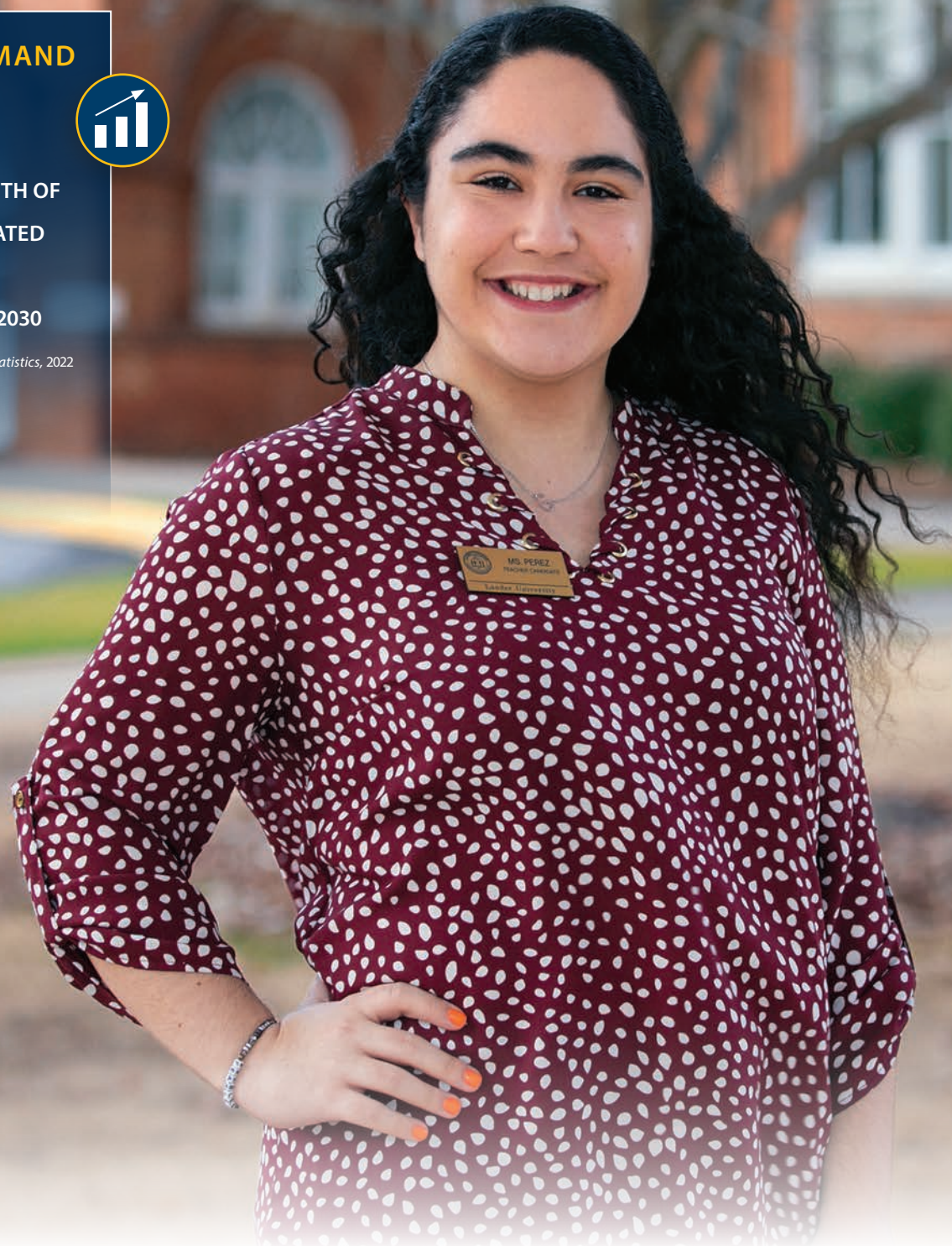

Military Science and Leadership

ROTC students benefit from unique training and practical experiences designed to hone and sharpen leadership skills. The ROTC program combines college courses in military science and leadership with rigorous summer training.

Respected and Revered

Lander is one of the few universities in the region that belong to the Scottish Highlander Battalion, and offers one of the fastest-growing ROTC programs in the state.



Launching Tomorrow's Heroes

The military science curriculum will offer you a fulfilling academic experience, consisting of a two-year Basic Course and a two-year Advanced Course.

ROTC Program and Curriculum

The Basic Course is open to all Lander students, without military obligation, and comprises freshman- and sophomore-level classes focusing on the fundamentals of leadership and personal development.

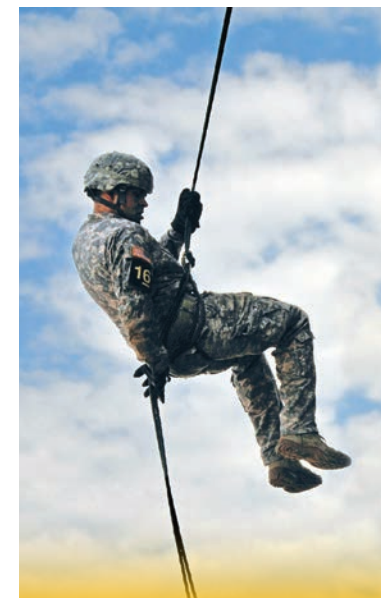
The Advanced Course comprises junior- and senior-level classes, and requires students to commit to a military obligation prior to entering the course. Advanced classes focus on leadership and tactics, and cadets learn to lead small units through a mission in both tactical and everyday environments.

A Bright, Honorable Future

Upon graduation from the ROTC program, you will be awarded a commission as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army, U.S. Army National Guard or the U.S. Army Reserve.

Lifelong Experiences

As an upper-class cadet in the ROTC program, you'll attend a 30-day Cadet Leadership Course, located at Fort Knox, Kentucky.





Transferring to Lander

Each year, Lander accepts students transferring from other colleges and universities throughout the region. You'll be guided and supported by a caring, seasoned staff of transfer admissions representatives, and you'll find the transfer process a smooth and seamless one.

Transfer Admissions Requirements

Students who have earned 12 semester hours or more of college-level work (post high school graduation):

- 2.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale at the last college attended
- Earned at least 12 semester hours at the last college attended; if not, all transcripts from previous institutions will be reviewed
- Official college transcripts from each institution attended
- Eligible to return to all previous institutions

Students who have earned fewer than 12 semester hours of college-level work (post high school graduation) and are under 21 years of age must meet freshman admissions requirements.

Washington Semester Program

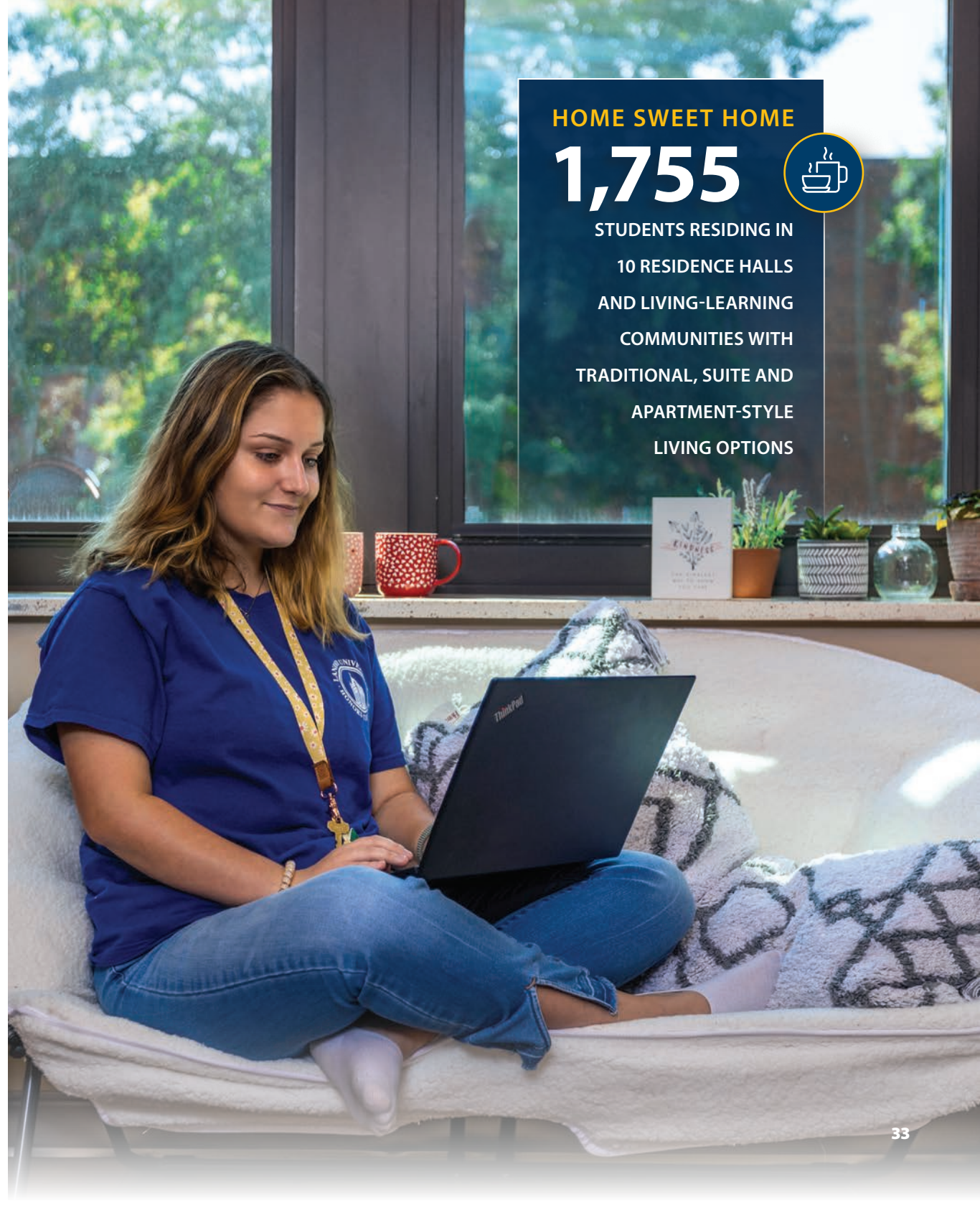

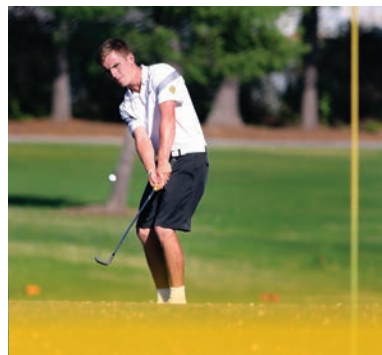
