I hereby grant that information requested by the SC Commission on Higher Education and the Department of Social Services may be released to them. These State agencies may access my personal demographic, academic, and financial information in order to provide academic and financial assistance.

Students are required to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Form in order to participate in the SC Need-based Grant program (SCNBG). Students who are eligible for SCNBG may also be eligible for the Foster Care Youth SCNBG and are responsible for contacting the institution and providing official verification to the institution and to CHE that he/she is in current custody of DSS (either in DSS custody or Independent Living Program through DSS). Acceptable verification shall include a letter or other verifiable documentation from DSS. Students only need to provide documentation once per institution.

In addition to the waiver form, the DSS case-worker must also submit a letter of verification that the above mentioned student is currently in custody of DSS and/or participating in the DSS Independent Living Program. Students who have been adopted or voluntarily left Foster Care/DSS are not eligible.

Deadline is May 1st.

NOTE: You may be eligible for assistance through federal programs for foster youth, such as the John H.
