Students completed the Leadership module video and slides on Blackboard, then submitted a Leadership SWOT analysis for self-assessment of their leadership qualities and potential, on Blackboard. A video about how to do a SWOT analysis was provided to students on Blackboard. Many students did not submit their SWOT analyses through Blackboard. Instructors were asked to use a grading rubric to evaluate the student work, but many instructors did not use the rubric.

1.6.3. **OUTCOME 3 COMMENTS:** All students on campus completed the SSI and so the data includes a large percentage of students that did not take LINK101. The outcome was partially met in that there was a statistically significant gain in SSI-18 data compared to SSI-15 data, but the effect size was considered small (less than 0.3). In subsequent years, it is hoped that with an increasingly larger proportion of LINK101 students taking the SSI, LINK101 will positively impact these numbers.

1.6.5. **OUTCOME 5 COMMENTS:** FYSA factor ratings were lower in this first year of the LINK Program as compared to the last year that UNI101 was taught (the previous iteration of the freshman seminar course), but the difference was not statistically significant. In addition, the effect size of that difference was considered small (<0.3), even though it was a decrease in ratings.

1.6.5.2. **EXPLANATION OF HOW RESOURCES WILL BE USED:** An Assistant Director for Enrollment and Peer Leadership (ADEPL) is requested, as peer leaders are implemented in year three of the program. The ADEPL would be responsible for recruiting, developing, and supporting peer leaders, who co-teach alongside university faculty and staff in the LINK101 classroom; complete paperwork for work-study compensation through the Office of Financial Aid; and serve as an instructor for a proposed leadership development course for the LINK101 peer leaders. In addition, the ADEPL would teach two sections of LINK101 – 1 in fall semester and 1 in spring semester, manage enrollment of all students in LINK101 sections during fall and spring semesters, and assist with fall and spring course scheduling of instructors.

1.7. **SUMMARY COMMENTS FOR OUTCOMES 1-5:**

The LINK Executive Committee (ExComm) working members met on 9/26/18 to discuss this report. Assessment results were discussed at several other ExComm meetings throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. Feedback for improvement from all LINK101 instructors was solicited during the “Mid-Semester Meet” (9/26/17) and the “End-of-Semester Wrap-Up” (12/13/17), and assessment results were shared with all LINK101 instructors at the LINK Academy #1 (5/10/18-5/11/18). The expected outcomes were partially met for the following indicators of success: Leadership module quiz, Leadership SWOT analysis assignment, and the SSI-18 improvement from SSI-15. For the SSI indicator, although there was a statistically significant gain ( $p < 0.01$ ) in SSI-18 compared to SSI-15, the effect size was considered “small” (<0.3). The expected outcome was not met for the Skyfactor FYSA factors related to the Leadership program goal.

1.8. **CHANGES MADE/PROPOSED TO PROGRAM AS A RESULT OF OUTCOMES 1-5:** Completion rates for and communication about the Leadership module quiz and the Leadership SWOT analysis will be improved by placing all students in LINK101 into the same Blackboard course and systematically assigning the same due dates to all students in all LINK101 sections, in addition to consistent communications and reminders in this environment. The Leadership module video, slides, and quiz questions will be edited for clarity and brevity to improve student scores. Instructors will be reminded how to use the grading rubric for the Leadership SWOT analysis, resulting in more consistent communication to students and grading of student work. The Program will foster stronger partnerships with various agencies on campus to increase student achievement and improve student perceptions regarding the Leadership outcome. In addition, all Blackboard modules will be assigned for all sections on the same weeks throughout the semester. This will facilitate co-sponsoring co-curricular events with other areas on campus that coincide with these LINK101 topics, such as Student Activities, Student Clubs & Organizations, Greek

Life, and Leadership activities, such as the Lander Leadership Conference. In addition, several students will be selected to pilot our LINK101 Peer Leader program in fall 2018, in which successful Lander students will act as mentors in the LINK101 classroom. Finally, the LINK Program will begin developing a Leadership Certificate program, to include other Leadership programs on campus, such as Orientation Leaders, Presidential Ambassadors, Residence Assistants, and others, as well as academic coursework related to Leadership.

2.6.1. **OUTCOME 1 COMMENTS:** This is the first year of this Program and the first year that this outcome was assessed. Data should be considered as a baseline for improvement in subsequent years. Students viewed a video and slides on this topic in Blackboard then completed this multiple-choice quiz on Blackboard.

2.6.1.2. **EXPLANATION OF HOW RESOURCES WILL BE USED:** N/A

2.6.2. **OUTCOME 2 COMMENTS:** This is the first year of this Program and the first year that this outcome was assessed. Data should be considered as a baseline for improvement in subsequent years. Students attended 8 “LINK-Approved” events/activities throughout the semester and were required to complete 8 “LINKed Events Reflection” essays. A document containing assignment guidelines and the grading rubric were provided to students on Blackboard. In class, instructors were expected to go over the guidelines, rubric, and how to submit the reflections using Blackboard. Many students did not complete all 8 reflections and several instructors did not require all 8 reflections. Instructors were asked to use a grading rubric to evaluate the student work, and instructor training in using the rubric was provided at the “LINK Mid-Semester Meet” (9/26/17) and a training video was provided, but many instructors did not use the rubric. Rubric data analysis was conducted by the LINK Program Assessment Committee during spring 2018. As a sampling method, rubric analysis data for reflections #2, #4, and #6, only from sections whose instructors indicated that they used the grading rubric, were collected for the purpose of this assessment.

The outcome was partially met in that there was a statistically significant gain in SSI-18 data compared to SSI-15 data, but the effect size was considered small (less than 0.3). It is notable that this number was 0.22, which is close to 0.3, indicating a small, but sizable impact. In subsequent years, it is hoped that with an increasingly larger proportion of LINK101 students taking the SSI, LINK101 will positively impact these numbers.

The ADCP would be responsible for the LINK Program's campus partnerships and co-curricular engagement – developing curriculum and training materials related to campus resources; managing the approval process for “LINK-approved” events; providing timely feedback based on assessment data from co-curricular programming; maintaining daily contact with students and instructors, in order to coordinate events; and lending support to the LINK101 peer leader program. In addition, the ADCP would teach two sections of LINK101 – 1 in fall semester and 1 in spring semester.

**2.7. SUMMARY COMMENTS FOR OUTCOMES 1-5:**

The LINK Executive Committee (ExComm) working members met on 9/26/18 to discuss this report. Assessment results were discussed at several other ExComm meetings throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. Feedback for improvement from all LINK101 instructors was solicited during the “Mid-Semester Meet” (9/26/17) and the “End-of-Semester Wrap-Up” (12/13/17), and assessment results were shared with all LINK101 instructors at the LINK Academy #1 (5/10/18-5/11/18). The expected outcome was met for the LINK101 LINKed Events Reflections, as 76.3% of students clearly connected the events they attended with their perspective of self and their achievement of the course outcomes. The expected outcome was partially met for SSI-18 improvement from SSI-15. For the SSI indicator, although there was a statistically significant gain ( $p < 0.01$ ) in SSI-18 compared to SSI-15, the effect size was considered “small” (<0.3). The expected outcomes were not met for the Student Handbook module quiz or the Skyfactor FYSA factors related to the Involvement program goal.

**2.8. CHANGES MADE/PROPOSED TO PROGRAM AS A RESULT OF OUTCOMES 1-5:** Completion rates for and communication about the Student Handbook module quiz and the LINKed Events Reflections will be improved by placing all students in LINK101 into the same Blackboard course and systematically assigning the same due dates to all students in all LINK101 sections, in addition to consistent communications and reminders in this environment. The Student

Handbook module video, slides, and quiz questions will be edited for clarity and brevity to improve student scores. Student compliance with completing LINKed Events Reflections will be improved by reducing the number of reflections required to two, although the program emphasis on Involvement will not be diminished as attendance at 8 events will still be required. In addition, training for instructors on using the rubrics and the importance of completing the rubrics online for assessment purposes will continue. Instructors will also be required to meet face-to-face with students during a midterm interview to discuss feedback from their first reflection assignment. It is hoped that students will take this feedback to improve in the final reflection. Assessment data for the next collection cycle will be collected from the final reflection only, representing the students' best and most representative work. The Program will foster stronger partnerships with various agencies on campus to increase student achievement and improve student perceptions regarding the Involvement outcome. In addition, all Blackboard modules will be assigned for all sections on the same weeks throughout the semester. This will facilitate co-sponsoring co-curricular events with other areas on campus that coincide with these LINK101 topics, such as Student Activities, Athletics, and Student Conduct.

The LINK Executive Committee (ExComm) working members met on 9/26/18 to discuss this report. Assessment results were discussed at several other ExComm meetings throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. Feedback for improvement from all LINK101 instructors was solicited during the “Mid-Semester Meet” (9/26/17) and the “End-of-Semester Wrap-Up” (12/13/17), and assessment results were shared with all LINK101 instructors at the LINK Academy #1 (5/10/18-5/11/18). The expected outcomes were partially met for the LINK101 core module quizzes (Career Services, Financial Literacy, and The Healthy Student). The expected outcome was also partially met for SSI-18 improvement from SSI-15. For the SSI indicator, although there was a gain in SSI-18 compared to SSI-15, it was not statistically significant and the effect size was considered “small” (<0.3). The expected outcome was not met for the Skyfactor FYSA factors related to the Networking program goal.

- 3.8. CHANGES MADE/PROPOSED TO PROGRAM AS A RESULT OF OUTCOMES 1-5:** Completion rates for and communication about the Career Services, Financial Literacy, and The Healthy Student module quizzes will be improved by placing all students in LINK101 into the same Blackboard course and systematically assigning the same due dates to all students in all LINK101 sections, in addition to consistent communications and reminders in this environment. The module videos, slides, and quiz questions will be edited for clarity and brevity to improve student scores. The Program will foster stronger partnerships with various agencies on campus to increase student achievement and improve student perceptions regarding the Networking outcome. In addition, all Blackboard modules will be assigned for all sections on the same weeks throughout the semester. This will facilitate co-sponsoring co-curricular events with other areas on campus that coincide with these LINK101 topics, such as the Wellness Center, Career Services, and Financial Aid.

The LINK Executive Committee (ExComm) working members met on 9/26/18 to discuss this report. Assessment results were discussed at several other ExComm meetings throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. Feedback for improvement from all LINK101 instructors was solicited during the “Mid-Semester Meet” (9/26/17) and the “End-of-Semester Wrap-Up” (12/13/17), and assessment results were shared with all LINK101 instructors at the LINK Academy #1 (5/10/18-5/11/18). Expected outcomes were met for the Blackboard/ITS core module quiz as 92% of all students that completed the quiz scored 70% or better. Expected outcomes were also met for the student improvement between the course pre-test and post-test. The improvement was considered “large” ( $ES > 0.8$ ) and statistically significant ( $p < 0.01$ ), indicating student gains in learning were considerable. The expected outcome was partially met for the LINK101 Academic Success core module quiz and the WDYK LINK Test #2 scores. The expected outcome was also partially met for SSI-18 improvement from SSI-15. For the SSI indicator, although there was a statistically significant gain in SSI-18 compared to SSI-15 ( $p < 0.05$ ), the effect size was considered “small” ( $ES < 0.3$ ). The expected outcome was not met for the Skyfactor FYSA factors related to the Knowledge program goal.

**4.8. CHANGES MADE/PROPOSED TO PROGRAM AS A RESULT OF OUTCOMES 1-5:** Completion rates for and communication about the Blackboard/ITS and Academic Success module quizzes and the “What Do You Know” (WDYK) LINK Tests #1 (course pre-test) and #2 (course post-test) will be improved by placing all students in LINK101 into the same Blackboard course and systematically assigning the same due dates to all students in all LINK101 sections, in addition to consistent communications and reminders in this environment. The Blackboard/ITS and Academic Success module videos, slides, and quiz questions will be edited for clarity and brevity to improve student scores. The Blackboard/ITS module video will include specific training in the new Blackboard Core course and will be assigned as the first module in the course to emphasize its importance. The WDYK LINK Tests will be updated to reflect all content and question changes from the modules. The Program will foster a stronger partnerships with various agencies on campus to increase student achievement and improve student perceptions regarding the Knowledge outcome. For example, LINK will partner with the Academic Success Center, by co-sponsoring academic skills workshops that will coincide with the week the Academic Success module is assigned in the course, which should improve scores in this content area. In addition, all Blackboard modules will be assigned for all sections on the same weeks throughout the semester. This will facilitate co-sponsoring co-curricular events with other areas on campus that coincide with these LINK101 topics, such as the Academic Success Center and ITS/TRACS.

5.6.5. **OUTCOME 5 COMMENTS:** All students on campus completed the SSI and so the data includes a large percentage of students that did not take LINK101. The outcome was not met in that there was no statistically significant difference in SSI-18 data compared to SSI-15 data, and the effect size was considered small (less than 0.3). In subsequent years, it is hoped that with an increasingly larger proportion of LINK101 students taking the SSI, LINK101 will positively impact these numbers.

5.7. **SUMMARY COMMENTS FOR OUTCOMES 1-5:**

The LINK Executive Committee (ExComm) working members met on 9/26/18 to discuss this report. Assessment results were discussed at several other ExComm meetings throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. Feedback for improvement from all LINK101 instructors was solicited during the “Mid-Semester Meet” (9/26/17) and the “End-of-Semester Wrap-Up” (12/13/17), and assessment results were shared with all LINK101 instructors at the LINK Academy #1 (5/10/18-5/11/18).

5.8. **CHANGES MADE/PROPOSED TO PROGRAM AS A RESULT OF OUTCOMES 1-5:** Several of the indicators of success for this outcome will not be valid until data is gathered from year two of the program (2018) and compared to year one (2017). However, retention rates higher than the university average, especially for “ambitious and talented” students who earned an A or B in LINK101, are a good indicator that this program is making a positive impact. In addition, several retention initiatives will be implemented next year to enhance retention and success of students in LINK101. Although LINK101 has no direct impact on recruitment of potential students or registration effectiveness, we chose these items in the SSI to monitor for an impact by this program. The LINK Program will continue to have a presence at Lander Open Houses and the Lander website, in order to impact recruitment of “ambitious and talented” students. In conjunction with the Academic Success Center, LINK101 instructors will be asked to assist with a freshman registration event in fall 2018. Instructors will be asked to assist students with navigating MyLander by looking up classes, completing the add course worksheet, registering for classes, and helping the student to troubleshoot when they cannot get the classes they would like. Many LINK101 instructors already spend class time assisting students in navigating MyLander as preparation for their registration for classes. It has been suggested that LINK101 instructors would make good secondary advisors to freshmen, in partnership with the first-year advisors. LINK101 instructors in the Nursing cluster may pilot this system in the fall 2018 semester. Finally, in the analysis report provided by Skyfactor, it was suggested that improving the factor “Usefulness of Course Materials” (which was mapped to this Unit/Program Goal) would make the greatest impact on ratings if improved for the subsequent year. The ExComm determined that providing students with a planner including custom pages with relevant information for Lander freshmen in LINK101 would make an impact on student perception of “Usefulness of Course Materials”. Planners purchased and distributed to freshmen at an opening assembly on 8/17/18 called “First Class LINK101”.
